1. California-Japan Sister Cities Network Spring Workshop

Sponsored by the Consul General of Japan in San Francisco Maeda Toru, The Consul General of Japan in Los Angeles Muto, Akira and the California-Japan Sister Cities Network, CJSCN presented the virtual Spring Workshop on Friday, May 14, 2021 from 4:30–6:30 p.m.

Theme: "Citizen Diplomacy through Technology and Innovation"

Workshop program:

- "How to Create Virtual Sister City Projects" by San Diego-Yokohama Sister City Society
